

#### **TERMINOLOGY AND ABBREVIATIONS**

## COOKIE BOX PATTERNS ADHERE TO US CROCHET TERMINOLOGY:

SC: SINGLE CROCHET

INC: INCREASE DEC: DECREASE

SL ST: SLIP STITCH

CH: CHAIN

**HDC:** HALF DOUBLE CROCHET

DC: DOUBLE CROCHET

This project is crocheted in continuous rounds, and we use «row» and «round» interchangeably.

#### **READING THE PATTERN**

ROW 4: [2 SC, INC] X 6 (24)

indicates the row or round number

a sequence consisting of 2 single crochet stitches followed by an increase

the amount of times you need to repeat the sequence in the row

or round

the total number of stitches you should have when you finish the row or round. back to contents

#### FINISHING CROCHET PIECES



DEPENDING ON THE PIECE YOU'RE WORKING ON, YOU WILL NEED TO USE ONE OF THESE METHODS TO FINISH IT OFF:

#### Invisible Fasten-Off:

Pull the yarn tail through the last stitch. Use a tapestry needle to thread the tail, then pass it under the stitch after the next one. Guide the needle between the "V" of the stitch you just came from, from top to bottom, and out the other side. Pull the tail so the new stitch matches the others in size. Lastly, weave the needle under the nearby horizontal bar for added security.

#### Fasten-off:

Slide the needle under the front loop of each of the six stitches, one by one, from the inside to the outside, then pull on the yarn tail to tighten the hole in the middle. Hide the yarn tail and cut off the excess yarn.

#### Crochet Edges Together:

Join the sides together. Align the first and last stitches of the round. Insert your hook through both stitches and make a single crochet stitch. Continue crocheting through both sides of the round. If it's easier, start with the first and second-to-last stitches instead.

#### **SEWING TECHNIQUES**

TO COMPLETE YOUR PLUSHIE, YOU WILL NEED TO USE THE FOLLOWING SEWING TECHNIQUES:

- Attach one 3D piece to another 3D piece.
- Join a flat piece to another flat piece.
- Attach a flat piece onto a 3D piece.

#### **HEAD AND BODY**

With yellow yarn

Magic ring

**ROW 1:** 6 SC (6)

**ROW 2:** 6 INC (12)

**ROW 3:** [SC, INC] X 6 (18)

**ROW 4:** [2 SC, INC] X 6 (24)

**ROW 5:** [3 SC, INC] X 6 (30)

**ROW 6-10:** 30 SC (30)

**ROW 11:** [3 SC, DEC] X 6 (24) **ROW 12:** [2 SC, DEC] X 6 (18)

Insert the eyes between Round 6-7, 5 stitches apart. Add Stuffing

**ROW 13:** [SC, DEC] X 6 (12)

**ROW 14:** 12 SC (12)

**ROW 15:** [SC, INC] X 6 (18)

**ROW 16:** 18 SC (18)

**ROW 17:** [2 SC, INC] X 6 (24)

**ROW 18:** 24 SC (24)

**ROW 19:** [6 SC, DEC] X 3 (21) **ROW 20:** [5 SC, DEC] X 3 (18)

Stuff the head and body completely.

**ROW 21:** [SC, DEC] X 6 (12)

**ROW 22:** 6 DEC (6)

Fasten off.



With yellow yarn Magic ring

**ROW 1:** 4 SC (4)

**ROW 2:** [SC, INC] X 2 (6)

**ROW 3 -10:** 6 SC (6)

Cut the yarn, leaving a tail of 6-10 inches. Invisible Fasten-Off.

#### **ARMS**

With yellow yarn. Make two.

Magic ring

**ROW 1:** 6 SC (6)

**ROW 2:** [SC, INC] X 3 (9)

**ROW 3:** 9 SC (9)

**ROW 4:** [SC, DEC] X 3 (6)

**ROW 5:** 6 SC (6)

Crochet the edges together to close the piece.

#### **LEGS**

With yellow yarn. Make two.

Magic ring

**ROW 1:** 6 SC (6) **ROW 2:** 6 INC (12)

**ROW 3:** [SC, DEC] X 4 (8)

**ROW 4-6:** 8 SC (8)

Crochet the edges together to close the piece.

#### **EARS**

With yellow yarn. Make two.

Magic ring

**ROW 1:** 6 SC (6)

TURNING CHAIN: CH 1, CONTINUE CROCHETING IN

THE OPPOSITE DIRECTION.

**ROW 2:** [SC, INC] X 3 (9)

Slip stitch to fasten off. Cut a 3-inch yarn tail. Pull the yarn tail through the last stitch completely.

#### MUZZLE

With white yarn. Make two.

Magic ring

6 SC (6)

ROW1:


Cut the yarn, leaving a tail of 6-10 inches. Invisible Fasten-Off.

#### **SEWING INSTRUCTIONS:**

- 1 Attach ears to the head, placing them between rows 2 and 6.
- 2 Position arms and legs wherever you think they look best.
- **3** Sew the tail to the back, placing it between rows 18 and 20.
- **4** Fix the muzzle to the face between rows 8 and 11, ensuring it lines up with the eyes.

#### **DECORATION INSTRUCTIONS:**

- 1 Cut a strand of yarn about 20-25 inches long for the nose and spots.
- 2 To make the nose:
- Start by threading a needle with the yarn.
- Push the needle from the back of the head to a spot between the muzzle.
- Sew three stitches in a triangle shape for the nose.
- Finish by pulling the needle out at the starting point for the spots.
  - **3** To add spots:
- Continue with the same yarn, sewing horizontal stitches (like those on the backside) for spots.





- Keep adding spots to your preference.
- If you run out of yarn, start a new piece by inserting the needle at a random stitch and bringing it out where you want the next spot.
- Leave a short tail of yarn when starting with a new piece so you can hide it later.

Remember to hide all yarn tails when finished by weaving them into the body.
